Tierce, Francoise

Francoise Tierce was born about 1656 in the parish of Saint-Sulpice in the faubourg Saint-Germain section of Paris, the daughter of Guillaume Tierce and Catherine Toué or Couré. After her mother's death, she left for Canada in 1671 at about age 15, bringing a dowry estimated at 200 livres.

On 13 October 1671, Francoise married Auffray Coulon dit Mabrian at Quebec City and was given the King's Gift of 50 livres. Neither spouse could sign the marriage contract drawn up 11 October by notary Becquet for which Jacques de Chambly, captain of the Carignan Regiment, was a witness. A plowman, Auffray was born about 1640 in La Chapelle-Bâton (arrondissement of Saint-Jean-d'Angély, diocese of Saintes), Saintonge, the son of Jean Coulon and Marie Pibelin. He arrived in Canada 18 Jun 1665 or September 1665 as a soldier with the Latour Company of the Carignan Regiment and was confirmed 20 May 1668 at Chambly. Prior to his marriage to Francoise, he annulled a marriage contract with Fille du Roi Marie Halay, drawn up 28 August 1670 by notary Becquet. Francoise and Auffray baptized daughter Marie-Jacqueline 10 October 1673 at Quebec City, then moved to Sorel, buying land from fellow Carignan soldier Jean Poirier dit Lajeunesse and his wife, Fille du Roi Marie Langlois (2) on 27 November 1674 (notary Adhémar). Son René was baptized at Sorel 26 March 1676.

Auffray Coulon dit Mabrian died 30 March 1677 and was buried the same day at Sorel. On 02 May 1677, Francoise married Pierre Guignard dit d'Olonne in Sorel. Neither spouse could sign the marriage contract drawn up 02 September 1678 by notary Maugue. Pierre was born about 1653 in the village of La Barre, parish of Notre-Dame-de-Monts (arondissement of Les Sables d'Olonne, diocese of Lu on), Poitou, the son of gardener Charles Guignard and Jacquette Coindrelle. He and Francoise settled at Lavaltrie. Son Pierre was baptized 13 March 1678 at Sorel, followed by Francoise (04 May 1680, Repentigny) and Jean-Baptiste (06 August 1682, Contrecoeur). Louise was baptized at Contrecoeur 27 August 1684, followed by Anne (08 January 1687) and Madeleine (born about 1690).

Pierre Guignard dit d'Olonne died at Lavaltrie between 30 December 1689 and 24 November 1702. On this last date, notary Adhémar drew up a marriage contract between Francoise and Pierre Vigne dit Toulouse, neither of whom could sign it. The two were married 08 February 1703 in Repentigny. A plowman, Pierre is the son of Pierre Vigne and Marie Defosses from Toulouse, Languedoc. He and Francoise settled at Berthier-en-haut, but had no children. Pierre Vigne died at Berthier-en-haut after 30 November 1718. Francoise Tierce died 20 April 1724 at Berthier and was buried at Sorel.
